December Great Grand Purification, December 31, 2020. 10:00 PM – 11:00 PM.

Please join us at the December Great Grand Purification at the Shrine. Then Jyoyasai will take us into the New Year.

New Year's Day – Daijingu opens from Midnight to 4:00 P.M. At nightfall on December 31st, people line up outside the Daijingu Temple of Hawaii to receive blessing from a Shinto priest. COVID-19 Pandemic must follow regulations of take social distancing, and wearing mask.

1. Clean Hands and Mouse at water basin. Two water faucets running so no need to close
 2. Omikuji fortunes written on paper, you can simply tie it to a nearby social hall entrance.
 3. Shaking the bell, someone standby to clean rope of bell by alcohol
 4. Following immediately after receiving blessing, you may go to the social hall to purchase good luck amulets.
 5. We will be accepting preorders of Omamoris, and booth set for alpha order for preorder
You may bring your 2020 Omamori to the Shrine for proper disposal.
- Parking will be at the Nuuanu Valley Park, and additional parking will be available at Boy Scouts parking lot across the shrine.
